## Before the Dig: A Twist on the Woodrow Wilson Presidential Library Annual Garden Party Tradition

Because between July 15<sup>th</sup> and August 9, we will be conducting our second summer archaeological investigation. The gardens behind the Manse will be checkered with excavation squares, looking for the stable, privy, smokehouse, and other areas of activity in the rear work yard!

This year, our Annual Garden Party will be held on Friday June 21<sup>st</sup> from 5-7 pm, and will feature appetizers from local restaurants and caterers, along with great Virginia craft brews and wine. Last year's dig confirmed that the garden behind the Manse holds significant potential for meaningful archaeology that will help us to better understand the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century Staunton into which Woodrow Wilson was born, and so much more about the lifeways of those who worked and lived in the house, but left no written records. This spring, with the help of volunteers and the Library of Virginia, we uncovered additional historic research that will help guide and inform this year's site work.

We are excited to again be teaming with Professor Dennis Blanton of the JMU Department of Sociology and Anthropology and several of his students.
